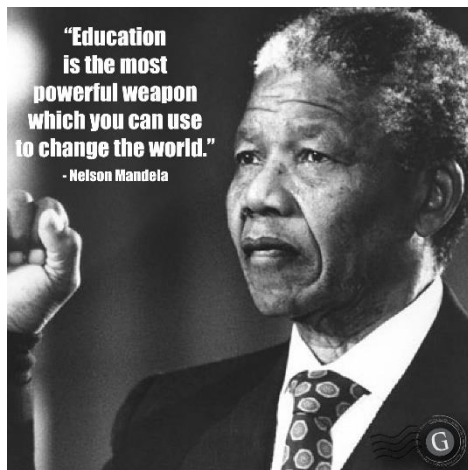




This is a sensitive time for all at the moment with Covid-19, protests that have been taking place all over the world following the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, USA.
