



Wednesfield High Specialist Engineering Academy Pupil Premium 2017.18 IMPACT

Allocation = £259.930 for the year 2017/18

Our Academy had 829 students on roll in Year 7 to 13, 35.3% (293 students) of whom are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding (any student that has received free school meals in the past six years).
